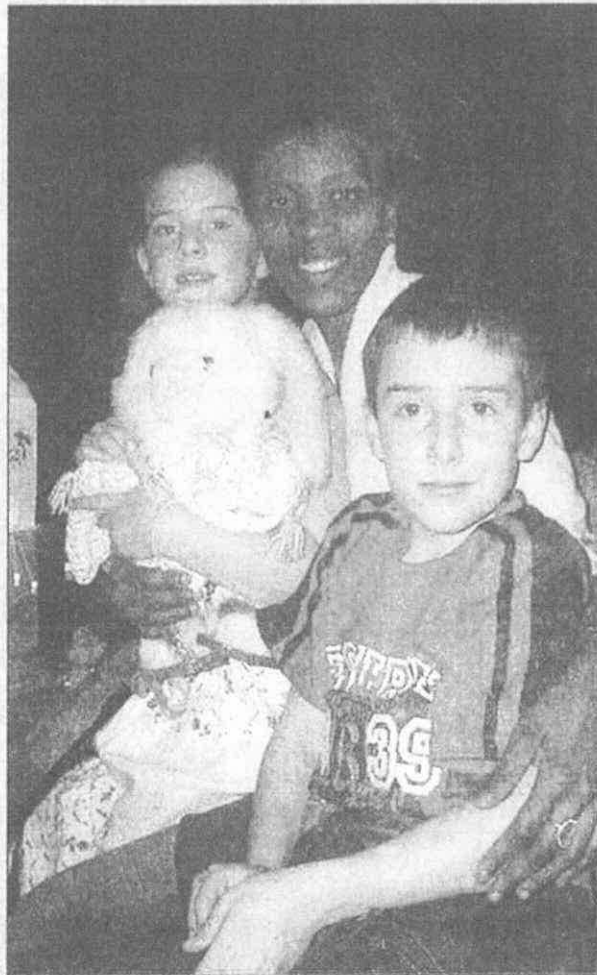
Two eight-week courses are
