### COVID-19 Vaccination Requirement

Only fully vaccinated travelers will be admitted into the U.S. **This means that all foreign visitors must be vaccinated against COVID-19 and must show proof of vaccination before boarding a U.S.-bound airline.** Click [here](#) for qualifying vaccines and doses.

**There is always some risk while traveling outside the U.S. on a J1 visa, re-entry is ultimately at the discretion of the port of entry agent. *However, if you are unvaccinated and choose to travel outside the US, you will be denied re-entry to the US.***

**\*The testing requirement to enter the US has expired and is no longer necessary\***

As of **12:01AM ET on June 12, 2022**, CDC will no longer require air passengers traveling from a foreign country to the United States to show a negative COVID-19 viral test or documentation of recovery from COVID-19 before they board their flight.
